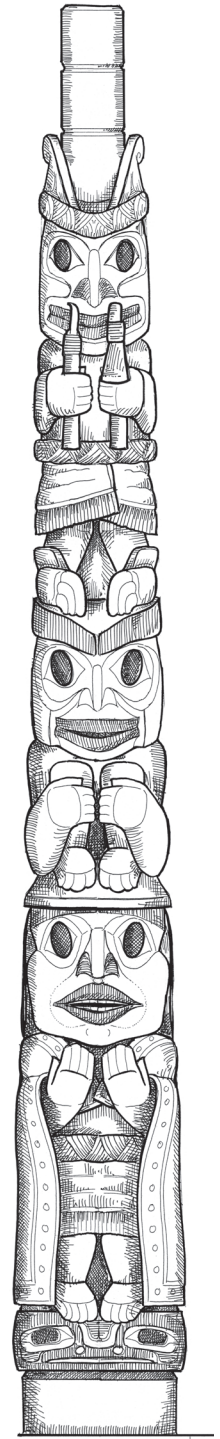
**1 p.m. Celebration of the Opening of the čičmāhán Trail Memorial Field, 550 Washington Street Port Townsend**

The čičmāhán Trail is a partnership between the Native Connections Action Group and the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe, with assistance from the entire community, to enhance understanding of the early history of the European settlers and their impact on the people indigenous to this area.

The Welcome Pole, Cedar Canoe, and Coast Salish Canoe Culture interpretive sign are gifts from the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe to the Northwest Maritime Center, to celebrate their shared love and respect for the Salish Sea and the vessels that ply its waters.



The Supernatural Carpenter, the Spirit of Western Red Cedar, čičmāhán, and Sentinel Rock are featured on this new totem pole designed by Dale Faulstich for the Northwest Maritime Center
